



KEY FINDINGS

- A total of 29,896 families were surveyed representing 147,653 family members (51% males and 49% females). Out of the total, 96% of the families were willing to return to their area of origin and while 4% were not ready to return to their area of origin.
- The analysis of the survey data of TDP families displaced from Orakzai agency indicates that 35% of the families have been displaced since 2009, followed by 30% families who were displaced in 2008.
- Analysis of income sources of the TDP families indicates that 44% were dependent on Farming/Sharecropping/Tenancy as major source of livelihoods, followed by daily wage labor (13% families). The next most significant sources of livelihoods was Shopkeeper/Trader (12% families)
- Majority of the respondents (96%) reported ownership of land in area of origin. Among them, 48% families owned land less than 1 acre, and 44% of the families owned land from 1-5 acre while remaining 8% families had ownership of more than 5 acre of land.
- The surveyed families identified cash for land preparation (52%), farming tools (35%), seeds (11%), fertilizers (2%) and water (1%) as five most important farming needs in the areas of origin.
- Almost all surveyed families (99%) confirmed that they owned houses in the areas of origin before displacement.
- An overwhelming majority of the surveyed families (99%) reported ownership of livestock in the areas of origin before displacement. However 90% families confirmed that they did not bring all the livestock to the areas of displacement.
- Majority of the families (60%) confirmed that their monthly household income was more than PKR 5,000. Another 31% have their average monthly household income in the range of PKR 2,500-5,000, while 4% families reported it to be less than PKR 1,000 per month.
- The families not willing to return to their areas of origin reported non availability of houses (37%), security situation (32%) and damaged community infrastructure (21%), as the main reasons for their unwillingness.
- Among the families willing to return to their areas of origin, the three top most priority needs identified are material for rebuilding house (37% families), security in area of origin (23% families) and food support (18% families).
- Out of all the families, only 181 confirmed that some of their family members were left in the area of origin.
- 16% of families reported that children are facing issues. Among these psychological and social distress was reported by 73% families while 17% families reported child labor as the main issue for their children.
- Only 17% of families reported family members with special physical needs, and significant number of families (71%) confirmed family members suffering chronical illnesses.





This bulletin demonstrates analysis of return intention and return priority needs of TDP families from Orakzai agency currently residing in six host districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province namely DI Khan, Peshawar, Kohat, Hangu, Nowshera and Charsadda. The information was validated through sample survey (random sampling) exercise from the existing dataset of Orakzai agency TDP families (collected in the past four phases of IVAP 2011- 2014) in the month of April 2016 through IVAP call center.


Figure 1: Families with Intention to Return (%)

Figure 4: Priority Farming Needs of Land Owner Families in the Area of Origin






Figure 5: Families with Ownership of Livestock in the Area of Origin (%)




Figure 6: Monthly combined household income in the area of origin (%)




Figure 8: Issues Faced by the Children (%)

Figure 7: Reasons for not Returning to the Area of Origin (%)




Figure 9: Planned Time to Return to Area of Origin (%)





Figure 10: Priority Needs to Return to the Area of Origin
